
11. EDUCATION

There were 3,289 academic establishments in Lebanon enrolling 1,174,756 students and recruiting 117,756 teachers/professors and 5,342 managers during the academic year 2006/2007.

Education breakdown in 2006/2007

Among the 3,289 institutions, there were 85.5% schools, 13.3% vocational schools and 1.2% universities and higher education establishments.

As for the sex of all types of education students and personnel, 50.6% of students were females and 63.9% of all personnel were females.

As for schools, 2.0% of schools were established ex ante 1920 and 33.6% ex post 1986. 35.6% of schools are public, 13.5% are private free and 50.9% are private. 2.6% are pre-school schools, 27.6% are elementary, 44.2% are intermediate and 25.6% are secondary. 55.7% of schools provide education in French language, 21.6% in English language and 22.7% in both languages.

As for students, 16.4% are in pres-schools cycle, 49.1% are in the elementary, 21.1% are in the intermediate and 13.4% are in the secondary. Another reading of student's distribution shows that 35.6% are enrolled in public schools, 13.5% in private free schools, and 50.9% in private schools. While, 63.3% are French educated and 36.7% are English educated.
